Rogers Topline Amendment

- Increases defense topline by nearly \$25 billion, ensuring growth of 3 percent above inflation.
- Provides for \$778 billion in total defense spending in FY22, a \$37.5 billion (5 percent) increase over FY21 enacted.
- Reverses President Biden's cuts to defense spending.
- Fully authorizes combatant commander unfunded priorities.
- Provides over \$15 billion to fill unfunded procurement, research, and readiness priorities of the services.
- Includes over 200 Member priorities not fully addressed by the Chairman's mark.
